### INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS for THEME ISSUES PUBLICATION

AS WE OBSERVE LESS AND LESS RESPECT OF THE *INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS*,  
FROM JAN. 1, 2004 ON WE ARE OBLIGED TO TAKE SEVERE DECISIONS :  
AN ACCEPTED PAPER NOT RESPECTING OUR RULES, WILL BE REJECTED,  
OR WILL BE IMMEDIATELY INVOICED FOR PUBLICATION COSTS (100 EURO OR 125 US\$ / HOUR)

#### Aims and Scope

The journal publishes original papers, notes, letters to editor, comments and reviews in the interdisciplinary science of cellular and molecular biology linking and integrating *molecular biology, biophysics, biochemistry, enzymology, physiology and biotechnology* in a dynamic cell and tissue biology environment, applied to human, animals, plants tissues as well to microbial and viral cells. The journal Cellular and Molecular Biology is therefore open to *intense interdisciplinary exchanges in medical, dental, veterinary, pharmacological, botanical and biological* researches for the demonstration of these multiple links. Any paper in our field may be accepted after severe peer reviewing.

#### **A/ Publication Form**

All papers concentrated around a theme, are published in printed issues, and as online full text publication. The authors themselves are responsible for a correct English language.

#### **B/ Peer Reviewing**

All papers will be peer-reviewed. The Author himself searches his own Peer Reviewers (PRs), but has to follow *precise indications*, staying in contact with them until the end. Each paper needs the acceptance by 2 PRs. *One of these PRs should be obligatorily from USA. Do NOT refer to scientists from your own institution, laboratory, faculty or university. Their complete addresses, titles and speciality(ies), their phone, fax and e-mail should be indicated on the back of the evaluation sheet* (as PDF file available on our site). After acceptance by 2 PRs, the paper should be sent to the Guest-Editor. He reserves to himself full liberty to take a 3d PR of his own choice. Contact the Guest Editor when you have problems to find your PR's.

#### **C/ Method of Submission**

Authors should submit their manuscript on a disk or CD-Rom, AND as a paper-printout.

#### **D/ Support and Submission**

The disk or CD must include one word processor file with the final accepted *complete text* and *cover sheet*. All figures on a separate CD or disk, in TIFF, JPEG or EPS format. ZIP disk 100 acceptable. **Burn CD in format hybride !**

The paper-printout must contain: one set of the complete final accepted text, references, figure legends, tables; original and high quality figures; cover sheet; all original evaluation sheets (no copies); full and complete names and addresses from all PRs; a statement indicating all changes made after peer review; the completed and by all authors signed checklist (as PDF file available on our site). Evt. written permission(s) for figure(s) reproduction.

E-submission may be done, but *always* a paper-printout and original figures, as detailed above, should be sent.

Make sure the final word processor file corresponds **exactly** to the accompanying final accepted printout. If different, the disk/CD version will be used!

#### **E/ Cover Sheet**

- Title of the paper, and
- Short Title, 50 characters or less.

- Corresponding Author/Address with fax, e-mail, and tel.
- Word Processor. The name and version of the word processing software used and that of the figures.
- Filename. The name of the manuscript file on the disk.
- Special Characters.

#### **F/ Order of Manuscript**

One word processor file should include the complete manuscript elements in the following order:

- Title
- Names of authors **First Name(s) only as INITIAL(S)**
- Their respective addresses
- Transmission date to 1st referee
- Acceptance date by last referee
- Abstract
- Key words
- Running Title
- Abbreviations
- Introduction
- Materials and Methods
- Results
- Discussion
- Acknowledgments
- References
- Figure captions
- Tables (as normal text, *without* Table-formatting!)

#### **G/ Typing Instructions**

Type the manuscript in paragraphs, like an ordinary private letter. Use throughout a uniform style and typeface: character Times New Roman 11; double leading out; 0,5 cm Tabs. For sub- and superscript use their respective commands (*do NOT use spacing up- and down-shifting*). Proofread the final text carefully to ensure that it is clear, grammatically correct and free of typographical errors. Footnotes should be avoided. Formatting and typography will be handled by the Editorial Executive.

In the proof, you will receive before publication, **ONLY TYPOGRAPHICAL ERRORS introduced by the editorial office** can be corrected. ***If additional corrections are made in the proof or if the set-up of the paper is modified, extra costs will be invoiced to you depending on the time required for these corrections (to 100 Euro or 125 \$ / hr).***

## H/ Title

Should not include non-standards abbreviations and must be brief.

## I/ Authors Affiliations

Include Department, Institution and complete address for each author. For different affiliations use superscripts <sup>1,2,3</sup>. The corresponding author is indicated with an <sup>z</sup> superscript. Fax and e-mail should be indicated below the corresponding author's address. The Editorial Office CORRESPONDS ONLY WITH THE INDICATED "CORRESPONDING AUTHOR".

## J/ Abstract – Key words

An abstract 100-200 words long should summarize the paper for abstracting services. NO references in abstract.

Key words, separated by commas, should be used for international abstracting services for indexing the paper.

## K/ Abbreviations

Should be presented :

in alphabetical list, first abbreviation, followed by the mean. Some standard abbreviations currently used in the text:

min    sec    hr    Fig.    ml

## L/ Equations

Equations in Materials and Methods, should have character 8,5; in the rest of the paper character 10,5; One column size is 8,5 cm; long equations should be presented on 2 or more lines, never exceeding the one column size. Behind ( or [ signs : please add one extra space.

## M/ Figures and Half-tones

Figures should be numbered sequentially. The number of figures should be in accordance with the paper length. Indicate the preferred placement of each figure in the word processor file, e.g. <Fig. 1>. Figures must be supplied as original hardcopy artwork AND as TIFF, JPEG or EPS high resolution e-files; NO images Word files, graphics files must not be imported into the word processor file. All legends should be included at the end of the word processor file, after the References.

Authors should submit **original artwork** of **high quality** and of **correct size**, as it will appear on the printed journal page:

full page size: maximum 17,5 cm (width) x 23 cm

1 column size: maximum 8,5 cm (width) x 23 cm.

On the back of each figure, lightly indicate with pencil the author's name, short manuscript title, figure number and orientation (arrow indicating up).

For coloured artwork, authors will be charged: 290 Euro or 338 US\$/page. IF YOU DO NOT ACCEPT THESE COLOR COSTS, DO NOT SEND COLOR IMAGES.

## N/ Tables

Should be presented clear and easy to read. Normally not more than 3 tables should be included. Include tables at the end of the word processor file after the figure captions. Use **tab stops of 0,5 cm and decimal tab stops to line up columns. DO NOT USE SPACES. NO TABLE**

## FORMATTING; NO Excel.

## O/ References

Cite references **in the text** following the numbered alphabetical references list, ex. (3,7,31). *Personal Communications* and *Submitted papers* are mentioned only in the text (submitted papers with journal citation).

**List the references at the end of the paper** in numbered ALPHABETICAL order, following the logical year sequence. *Do not use automatical numbering.* Accepted papers should indicate the acceptance date; Use international standard abbreviations. Words ending in "ology" should be abbreviated "ol." (e.g. Biol.) and words ending with "eutical" should be abbreviated as "eut." (e.g. Pharmaceut.). Cite all authors names, full pages numbers. **PRESENT THE REFERENCES IN CMB-STYLE EXACTLY AS SHOWN BELOW (RESPECTING THE COMMAS, THE DOTS, ITALICS, BOLD, PLACE OF THE YEAR, THE WORD "and" BEFORE THE LAST AUTHOR'S NAME, etc.):**
